In recent times, God has been getting my attention on the matter of peace and trust and how these relate to Him. I was already feeling challenged about this (more on that later)when the sermon at church last week was about refusing to worry and instead, choosing to trust in God and rest in His peace. The message was that our enemy wants us to do things in our own strength and 'wisdom' yet true peace and wisdom require us to trust God, in all things at all times. Then my devotional this morning focussed on knowing where my hope lies, is it in the riches of this world? Or in my ability to get things done? What am I beholding and worshipping? It offered a caution to beware that I am in danger of becoming whatever I behold and worship.

I mention that I was already feeling challenged by this, deeply, and rightly so. A dear friend in the UK recently went home to be with Jesus. Thanks to COVID and Zoom, I was able to live stream the Thanksgiving Service from my living room and join in the tears and laughter as we celebrated a well-lived life cut short by cancer. Testimony upon testimony spoke of my friend's ability to love others, no matter who they were, of her creativity, and her passion to help others come to know and follow Jesus. Perhaps most challenging was the description from the pastor of his visits to her in the hospice. He spoke of how he and his wife would visit Lucy and of the peace that pervaded the room. He described it as 'a thin place', a Celtic Christian term for those rare places where the distance between heaven and earth collapses.

In the face of her toughest battle, Lucy had come to a place where she trusted in God and found peace and hope. Not only this, she allowed it to saturate the atmosphere around her so that others could also experience it. She delighted to take communion, wanting to eat and drink it all up in the presence of her enemy, death. In her final months, Lucy wrote a poem, reflecting on the invitation to trust in Jesus, in each and every situation. This poem challenges, invites and comforts me in equal measure and is printed below, I pray it will do the same for you.


# 9/10: English / History

Who says high school has to be boring! "Making writing" is a real thing, using playdough, natural objects, buttons, lego, old game pieces etc to symbolise a reader's thought process as part of planning writing. As part of our brainstorming process for a personal reflective essay on the transformative power of literature, on books set against the backdrop of WW2 and the holocaust, 9/10 students used these "loose parts' to create a 3D visualisation of their ideas before writing. They practiced symbolism by using objects to represent their ideas, then speaking them out before they then transitioned to alphabetic text. Students moved onto labelling their work, then creating sentences and then finally paragraphs in an intentional effort to slow the writing process down and to spark ideas. This was part of a cross-curriculum unit of English and History. Students had chosen to read either "The Book Thief", "The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas", the graphic novel "Maus" or "The Diary of Anne Frank" in literature circles, with lively discussion ensuing. Take a look at the photos to see their thoughtful ideas.




