

A Little Update from Mr. MacKenzie's Classes

High School Math

In Year 7/8 Students are working on what is called SAM. This is the study of shape, angles, and measurement. Students are presently creating a flow chart for describing any shape. Their end of year Math Project will be to create a recycled art piece or a recycled material marble run. They will then draw it on the Cartesian plane, measure and explain its angles and dimensions as we explore the practical aspects of shape, angles, and measurement.

In Year 9/10 Students are working on understanding Linear Equations and having great fun. Maybe that is me having great fun. We are getting them ready for the more serious math that awaits their future years.

7/8 Civics

Students have been considering two statements. "We cannot create a harmonious nation," and "All values are equally good for the identity of a nation."

They will be soon beginning an assignment to consider these topics:

- What does it mean to be Australian?
- How and when should we celebrate what it means to be Australian?
- What should the Australian Flag look like?
- What should our National Anthem be?
- Who should the Australian head of state be?

Each will be based on research and the students' opinions. These are very important topics for students to think about and develop well-grounded positions on.

They will be assessed on their ability to understand the question and not their opinions.

High School History

In Year 7/8 Students are building on their historical skills by completing an investigation into an ancient civilization.

In Year 9/10 students are showing their historical skills as they undertake a detailed study of former Empires and Kingdoms from many years ago.

All this history work will be displayed in a timeline at the end of year showcasing their wonderful work.

7/8 Bible

In this class we are doing a few things. Exploring a Biblical Worldview & looking at a series called Christianity Explored.

ODE for Year 7/8

The Ark takes center stage for our ODE programs on a Friday Afternoon as we continue to serve City Mission on this project.

Students will also be developing some survival skills during Term 4.

Bible in the Primary School


