Good Friday - Easter Sunday

Is it just me who has raised their head from the busyness to find it's almost the end of term? I know it isn't (only me, that is), and I also know there are many in our community facing trials and challenges, or feeling exhausted and overwhelmed at the moment. So, where's God in all of this?

He is near, and he is near with so many promises for us, it can be hard to take them all in. Sometimes, it can be hard to know He is near. He is still near. And He has promised: That we need not be anxious for anything,[1] but through prayer, we can cast all our burdens on him because He cares for us.[2] In this world, we will have troubles but we can take heart, He has overcome the world.[3]

Jesus was a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief.[4] He knew what it was to suffer. We need only read the story of His journey to Gethsemane and on to the cross.[5] I often wonder how the disciples felt at that time...lost? Confused? Desolate? Betrayed, even? I marvel at the dignity Jesus showed, and the grace and mercy as he hung on the cross, feeling the physical pain but far worse than that, feeling the total separation from God.

I wasn't always a follower of Jesus, I only met him in my late 20s. I know what it is to be separated from Him. Even in my walk with Jesus these last 20+ years, I know what it is to pull away from Him, to rail against Him, to be angry with Him, and to question His goodness, even His power and sovereignty.

And yet, in God's infinite mercy, He has used the trials of life to shape me to be more like Him. He has used them to heal me of the wounds that stop me from being the person He made me to be. In the trials of the last year, I have seen God's goodness and glory, and believe them all the more for the challenges I have passed through.

So, my prayer for each of us is this: That in the trials and desperate times, we would lean all the more into God, that we would rely on Him rather than ourselves, that we would trust that He is sovereign and He is mighty; that He is working all things together for good for those who love him. Though it may feel like a long Good Friday, may we remember that Easter Sunday will surely come, and the power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in our lives and in every situation. May we remember, we follow a resurrected Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

And so, as we head to these days when we remember the original Good Friday and Easter Sunday, maybe we can make some time to check:

Where am I at with Jesus, today? Is He still Lord of ALL my life? Or do I need to dedicate my life to him afresh, or even for the first time? There is no better day than today to invite Jesus to be Lord of all your life. I can testify from my own experience, life is so much better when He is Lord of all.

Praying you know resurrection power, love, and peace this Easter.

LOST PROPERTY

We recognise that it is inevitable that items will be misplaced by students and visitors to the school.

Are you missing anything? Now is a good time to have a look in the tubs, as they are cleaned out at the end of term. Below is a copy of the lost property policy.


There are two collection points for lost property. One is located in the senior hub and the other is in the junior hub, where children and adults can look for missing items.

- Parents and students are encouraged to name and label all personal items including clothing, books, and stationery.
- Misplaced items that are inappropriate to be returned to students will be delivered to the principal who will contact parents to collect items.
- Parents or students seeking lost items should check the lost property to claim items.
- Unclaimed but named items will be returned to their rightful owners after each clean-up of the lost property.
- Unclaimed and unnamed items will be displayed by the members of the SRC in a prominent place on the last assembly of each term.
- Unnamed uniform items that are still unclaimed will be washed and placed in the second-hand uniform store or disposed of, at the end of each term.
- Other unclaimed items will be disposed of or donated to charity (eg. City Mission) at the end of each term.
- Camp and excursion lost property will be displayed at the next assembly and any unclaimed items will be disposed of at the end of the term.
