## **BUILDING UPDATES**

Hi Parents and other Caregivers,

It is not often I write in the newsletter, but I have been known to do so. Today is one of those times. Late last year we updated our Strategic Plan and came up with some building items that we see as helpful, if not essential to learning for students at NCS. Last year we built the junior playground, and this year we have replaced the windows and doors in the 7/8 room and the 5/6 room with safety glass. Most of these items are only possible through the fees and donations we receive from parents and other friends of our school.

As it is tax time, all donations made to our building fund before 30 June 2022 are eligible as a deduction on your personal tax return for the year 2022-2023. I do ask that you consider a donation in order to help pay for the improvements that we hope to complete this year I have listed below:

We have ordered a shade sail on the turf area outside the tech room, as well as four mighty rainproof umbrellas on the deck behind the junior area. This will create a large new outdoor classroom accessible from the two sliding doors in the junior classrooms, as well as extra shade for the students. We applied and received a special government grant to help pay for the shade sails, but this is only a third of the total cost.

We are also planning for new toilets in the juniors by the year end, as well as a glass wall to separate and reduce the sound from the Computer lab into the Library area. # TERRIFIC TASSIE TOUR




During Terms 2, 3 and 4, NCS students have been challenged by Mrs Nugteren to see if they can virtually run around Tasmania, 1835km in total. This activity is developing skills in maths and geography well developing as students as understanding of the benefits of health and physical activity and building their fitness. Students are collecting pop sticks for each lap (around the school grounds), 4 laps equal a kilometre. This helps develop their maths skills and it's a sense of achievement, with every stick counting toward the class total.

Each student in Grade 3-6 has developed the course, walking around with the trundle wheel to design it. After they designed and measured the course, they then came up with personal fitness goals, which will be revised several times throughout the year to see if they have achieved them or need to adjust them.



You may have seen a map in the window in the Primary School, this is showing the track we are going along and where each class is so far. There is a small figure with the teachers faces to show how far each class has gone. Ms Hooley is also on the map showing how far the whole school has gone. She is already made it to the third target, Port Arthur, so we are well on our way to getting around the state.



The students have opportunities throughout the week to do laps, once a week in daily PE, sometimes it is a warmup for PE lessons and then at recess time when Mrs Nugteren is on duty. Some students only run once a week while others take up every opportunity to help their classes move further around the state. Next term, we will add a few extra opportunities when other staff are on duty so that students can run more laps.

Throughout this process we hope students will build on their fitness and enjoy doing some extra physical activity, encourage each other along the journey and achieve their goals, and together we can get around Tasmania.

Feeling concerned about the impact of technology on kids? Wondering how to establish better screen habits for your primary school-aged children and younger? You're not alone.


Join me for a FREE 3-week tech-parenting course on Zoom, scheduled for June 8th, 15th, and 22nd from 8-9:15pm.

### **COLD & FLU REMINDER**

#### Dear Parent or Guardian:

The cold and flu season is upon us once again. To prevent widespread flu in the school, we recommend that your child stay home from school if experiencing flu or cold symptoms. To decide whether to send your child to school, please consider the following guidelines:

# Consider keeping your child at home for an extra day of rest and observation if they have any of the following symptoms:

- Very stuffy or runny nose and/or cough
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Stomach ache

# Please keep your child at home for treatment and observation if they have any of these symptoms:

- Fever
- Vomiting
- Diarrhoea
- Chills
- General malaise or feelings of fatigue, discomfort, weakness or muscle aches
- Frequent cough / sneeze

### To help prevent the flu and other colds, teach your children good hygiene habits:

- Wash hands frequently
- Do not touch eyes, nose or mouth
- Cover mouth and nose when sneezing or coughing, use a tissue, throw it away and then wash hands. If no tissue, cough or sneeze into elbow, not your hands
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Colds are the most contagious during the first 48 hours. A child who has a fever should remain at home until "fever free" for a minimum of 24 hours. Often, when a child awakens with vague complaints (the way colds and flu begin) it is wise to observe your child at home for an hour or two before deciding whether to bring him/her to school. Your child should be well enough to participate in all physical school activities on return to school.
